



MODE OF EXAMINATION

 Examination will be conducted on Friday/Saturday, the details of which shall be announced at least 30-45 days in advance. Depending on the number of JANBI candidates, several exam centers will be set up in different parts of the country. Notice of exam centre shall be published in NBI's website at least 3-4 weeks before the examination.

 Each question paper shall have 120 objective type multiple choice questions and each candidate can choose to answer any 100 questions. The institute may, however, vary the number of questions to be asked for a subject. There will NOT be negative marking for wrong answer.

DURATION OF EXAMINATION


The duration of examination will be 2 hours for each subject.


EXAM SCHEDULE


The examination will be conducted on a half yearly basis in June and December.

PASSING CRITERIA

 Pass: A minimum mark to pass in every subject is 50.

 Candidate attempting all 3 subjects in a single block of examination, if happens to score between 45-49 in any one subject but has combined aggregate of 50%, then the candidate is considered to have qualified/cleared/passed.


 Candidates will be allowed to retain credits for the subject/s they have passed in one attempt till the expiry of the time limit for passing the examination as mentioned under "Criteria of the Examination".


 Grading will be awarded only if a candidate passes all three subjects in the very first block of examinations attempted. Score between 60% to less than 70% will be awarded 1st division while those scoring 70% or above will be awarded distinction.

 Grading will not be applicable if a


candidate who has failed before in one or more subjects now passes by appearing in all three subject examinations of a single block.

CRITERIA OF THE EXAMINATION:

 The Candidates are required to pass JANBI examination (3 subjects) within a time limit of 2 years.

 Initial registration fee will cover two attempts of examination for each subject, which is clarified as follows:

- Candidate must attempt all 3 subjects in the very first block of examinations s/he chooses. But if s/he can not pass the exam of one or more subjects then s/he can attempt second time for the failed subject/s only.
- Similarly, if s/he fails in all subjects in the first attempts then s/he can attempt in the second time.
- Absent in the examination despite of having registered for examination will be treated/counted as failed attempt.
- In case a candidate fails in any/all subjects in 2 attempts, he/she may attempt upto 2 more attempts with the additional fee of NPR 6000/- within the validity period of 2 years.
- Any skipped (un-attempted)/failed examination would lead to the reduction in the number of attempts available within the validity period.

 Candidates who can not pass all subjects within the stipulated 4 attempts for each subject even after paying additional fee of Rs 6,000 within 2 years are required to re-enroll themselves afresh by submitting fresh application. Such candidate will not be granted credit/s for subject/s passed, if any earlier.
